






President's Message



Academic Regalia

The design and heraldry of academic attire date back to approximately the 12th century when universities were taking form. It's believed that the attire was the dress of a cleric because scholars had taken minor orders or vows. The dress may have also served another purpose—it provided warmth.

Our graduates display their academic achievements by wearing hoods at the commencement along with gowns and caps. The hood is lined with one or more chevrons. The colors of the hood represent the University and degree earned by the student. The College of Chiropractic colors are green and gold. Green symbolizes healing or medicine and golden yellow symbolizes science. Placing of the hood symbolizes entry of the candidate into the rights and responsibilities of the profession.

It's also customary for the University's leadership to wear academic attire. This is an outward sign of bringing together students as privileged persons under the same discipline.

Symbolism of the University Seal

The design of the Northwestern Health Sciences University seal is rooted in its traditions, history and mission since its founding in 1941.

- The circular shape expresses the unity and shared mission of the University's colleges and clinics.
- The shield represents the resilience and strength of the body, nurtured by natural healthcare providers.



- The crown symbolizes excellence in education, patient care, research and community involvement.
- The pine tree and North Star are natural symbols closely associated with Minnesota and derived from the state's Great Seal.
- The griffin symbolizes the academic virtues wisdom and intelligence, represented by the eagle, and strength and bravery, signified by the lion.
- The Rod of Asclepius represents medicine and healing. It originated in Greek mythology and is associated with the god of healing.
- Scientia is Latin for "knowledge."





Northwestern Health Sciences University

Established 1941

Northwestern Health Sciences University's roots of educational excellence trace back to 1941 with the founding of Northwestern College of Chiropractic by Dr. John B. Wolfe, a civil engineer turned doctor of chiropractic. Dr. Wolfe's vision and dedication ultimately gave rise to an institution of higher learning with a reputation for excellence in educating healthcare professionals, producing exceptional clinical research and providing outstanding patient care.

In 1964, expansion was needed to accommodate enrollment growth and the institution moved from its original location in downtown Minneapolis to a new campus on Park Avenue, and in 1974, to an even larger campus in St. Paul. In 1983, Northwestern moved to its current location on a 25-acre campus in Bloomington. The new facility provided students with all the amenities of a university, including laboratories, classrooms, a library, public clinics, and services to create a rich student life.

Growing consumer interest in natural therapies, including acupuncture and massage therapy, prompted leadership to actively explore adding new degree programs and clinical services. The college became a university in 1999, when it acquired the Minnesota Institute of Acupuncture and Herbal Studies, founded by Minnesota acupuncture pioneer Edith R. Davis. The School of Massage Therapy was established the following year, making Northwestern one of the first academic institutions to offer multiple natural healthcare programs.

Since 1991, the Wolfe-Harris Center for Clinical Studies has been the locus of research in the institution, and the Center for Healthcare Innovation and Policy was formed in 2010 to serve as the advocacy and public policy voice of the University. In 2013, Northwestern's role as a thought leader again expanded with the formation of the H.C. Sweere Center for Clinical Biomechanics and Applied Ergonomics, and in 2014, by establishing the Human Performance Center, which offers specialty clinical services in sports injury prevention and treatment, and advanced rehabilitation.

Now offering degrees in acupuncture and Oriental medicine, chiropractic, therapeutic massage, and human biology, Northwestern Health Sciences University serves nearly 900 graduate and undergraduate students, more than 5,600 continuing education students, and has an alumni community of more than 7,500 graduates. Our 280 dedicated faculty and staff provide an engaging and supportive learning environment that includes academic and career counseling, assistance for international students and military veterans, and nearly 50 student clubs and organizations.

As we approach our 75th anniversary in 2016, under the leadership of our seventh president, Dr. Christopher Cassirer, the University is poised for growth in academic programming and pursuit of a new healthcare innovation and research agenda that will contribute to the advancement of health and wellness through integrative care.
