Abstract (or Book Review):	Objective. To summarize evidence on: (1) the accuracy of brief cognitive tests for identifying clinical Alzheimer's-type dementia (CATD) in individuals with suspected cognitive impairment; (2) the accuracy of biomarkers for identifying Alzheimer's disease (AD) in individuals with dementia; and (3) the benefits and harms of prescription drugs and supplements for cognition, function, and behavioral and psychological symptoms of dementia (BPSD) in patients with CATD.
